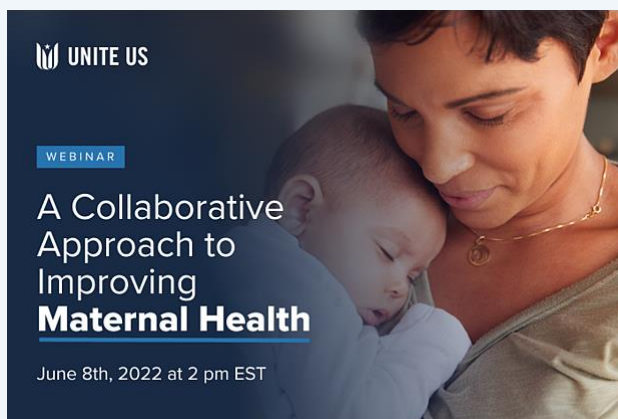
Through **community-driven approaches** and **culturally competent models of care**, CBOs are well-positioned to play an active role in improving maternal health
