TAC is a comprehensive, evidence-based training designed to provide mental health professionals and master’s level child welfare and adoption professionals with the clinical knowledge and skills needed to effectively serve the adoption kinship network. TAC is accredited by the Institute for Credentialing Excellence and is the only accredited, assessment-based certificate program on adoption competency in the country.

Program Eligibility

- Master’s degree (or higher) in social work, a counseling field or other related discipline; **and**
- Current professional license or under clinical supervision in preparation for professional licensing.
- Applicants without a clinical license must have work experience with members of the adoption kinship network that provides opportunities to incorporate learning into practice.

TAC is a 72-hour curriculum. Classes typically meet once per month via a virtual platform. This is a 12-month commitment.
